## Why we need this role

Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust is committed to engaging people with nature. We deliver a huge variety of opportunities for people to learn about the natural world. This role needs someone who can confidently engage with young people, inspiring them to care about wildlife and to engage with their local green space. You will gain experience empowering young people and also have the opportunity to learn about conservation alongside them.
